3. The student will demonstrate singing with clear articulation by singing with their choral section for the choir director.
4. The student will demonstrate singing with integrity in the styles of various music cultures within their section for the choir director.
5. The student will demonstrate improvement in sight singing pitch and rhythm in their choral section by sight signing with their choral section for the choir director.
