Continuing to expand the tertian vocabulary to include diatonic triads, secondary dominants, non-chord tones, modulation, and an introduction to 20th century musical forms.

Course Learning Outcomes:

Learning Outcomes – Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

- 1. Construct and identify advanced chromatic harmonies.
- 2. Analyze musical compositions that utilize advanced chromatic harmonies and foreign-key modulation techniques.
- 3. Analyze musical compositions that utilize a variety of post-tonal practices.
- 4. Compose music utilizing appropriate post-tonal practices.
- 5. Demonstrate musical concepts covered in class on the keyboard.
- 6. Demonstrate an understanding of rhythmic meter and note duration through score analysis and composition.

Methods of Assessment:

- 1. The student will receive periodic compositional projects in which to incorporate basic part-writing skill of the advanced harmonic vocabulary.
- 2. The students will perform tasks that increases their knowledge of non-chords. Understanding will be assessed by work sheets, weekly assignments and tests.
- 3. The student will develop new techniques for composing projects which incorporate techniques from the Renaissance and Baroque periods.
- 4. The students will perform assignments that increase their knowledge of the various types of modulations used in music. Understanding will be assessed by worksheets, weekly assignments, and tests.
- 5. Students will become familiar with various styles of 20th century music.
- 6. The students will work on analyzing these new styles. Understanding will be assessed by worksheets, weekly assignments, and tests.
