- 4. Create business documents and analyze data with spreadsheet software using (1) tables, sorting, filtering, charts and graphics, pivot tables, and macros; (2) statistical, financial, logical, and look-up functions and formulas; and (3) add-ins.
- 5. Create business multimedia presentations with presentation software using templates, lists, groups, themes, colors, clip art, pictures, tables, transitions, animation, video, charts, and views.
- 6. Create and manage data with database software using tables, fields, relationships, indexes, keys, views, queries, forms, reports, and import/export functions.
- 7. Integrate business software applications.
- 8. Use web-based technologies to conduct ethical business research.
- 9. Use "goal seeking" and "what-if analysis" to solve problems and make adjustments/recommendations in a business environment.
