SCHEDULE:

Classes meet Monday-Thursday from 1:00pm-2:00pm and 2:15pm-3:15pm. We encourage you to enroll each child in two classes. Select courses according to the grade that your child will be entering in the fall of 2009. Classes are located on the Wharton Campus of Wharton County Junior College.

REGISTRATION:

Registration is located in the Administration Building. Registration begins April 20, 2009, and ends June 8, 2009. Registration in person is recommended. Classes will close when they are full; a second choice may be needed. Enroll early! Office Hours: Monday-Thursday, 8:00pm-4:00pm. All registration by mail must be mailed prior to June 1, 2009 to the Registration Office, 911 Boling Hwy, Wharton, TX 77488.

REFUND POLICY:

Request will be honored if made in person four full working days prior to the first day of class.

FIRST DAY PROCEDURES:

Location: WCJC Fitness Center Gym

Arrive with your child 15 minutes early on the first day. Students will pick up their name badge that will have his/her schedule. Students will line up in the gym by their class sign. Instructors will escort students to the classroom area. Students not in the gym at 1:00 pm each day are late. They must be escorted to their class area by the parent.

DROP OFF & PICK-UP PROCEDURES – Safety Comes First:

The drop-off area for Kids' College students is the Fitness Center gym located at 911 Boling Highway. Parents are not to drop off their child earlier than 12:45 pm each day.

- All 2:15 pm classes officially end at 3:15 pm. At 3:15 pm students will begin the walk to the pick-up area.
- Pick-up time is no later than 3:25 pm. Please be prepared to park if your child's class has a long walk.
- Students taking only a 1:00 pm class should be picked up at the Fitness Center at 2:00 pm.
- Please park your car and do not block traffic.
- For safety reasons, do not drop off or pick up children at unspecified locations.
- For safety, all parents will be required to show identification and sign their child out when picking them up early from the classroom.
- Early pick-up from the classroom is for emergencies only.
- Students taking only a 2:15 pm class need to pick up their name badge in the Fitness Center foyer.
- Parents need to bring their children to the Fitness Center foyer at 2:00 pm for the 2:15 pm class.

LATE PARENT PROCEDURE:

Children left after the regular pick-up times will be brought to the Fitness Center foyer.

WEATHER:

Instruction will take place indoors on rainy days. In severe weather conditions when no travel is advised, the program will be cancelled. For unforeseen incidents, check for information updates on signs posted in front of the Fitness Center. Kids' College will follow all WCJC safety procedures.

EXPECTED BEHAVIOR:

All Kids' College participants are expected to show respect for staff, peers, and property. Students may be removed from a class for disruptive behavior or removed from the program for repeated disruptive behavior. No refunds will be given in these situations.

- ILLUSIONS Gr. 1-3**
 Learn the how-to of tricks of the eyes. Amaze your friends and family with optical illusions. Stretch your mind as you develop an understanding of how illusions work.
- HOOKE ON BOOKS Gr. 1-3**
 The best way to become a good reader is to listen to award winning stories. Improve listening comprehension with follow-up activities, games, crafts, and songs.
- JAZZY JUMP ROPE Gr. 1-3**
 Learn many fancy techniques of jump roping while improving your speed and coordination.
- MONEY, MONEY, MONEY Gr. 1-3; 4-8**
 Economics can be fun with checkbooks, credit accounts, loans, stock investments, and profit-making ideas. Learn how to make a plan for saving and spending. Students will work on a group project.
- PUPPET FEST Gr. 1-3**
 Students will gain knowledge and apply it in this fun class. Students will create and build many styles of puppets. Students will also learn applications of puppetry techniques and definitions.
- TOTALLY GIRL Gr. 1-3**
