

Public/Private/Home-schooled high school students may attend Wharton County Junior College Dual Credit courses following the completion of their sophomore year in high school.

Required documents:

1. **Submit your application** online at https://www.applytexas.org/adappc/gen/c_start.WBX. The on-line application is quick and easy, follow the steps. Once your application has been processed, you will receive letter by email or regular mail service that will outline the next steps you need to take in the admissions process and ask you to set up your college outline services account (how you will register for classes). Processing time may vary during peak registration periods. Please allow up to 96 hours processing time. You only need to submit one new application. It is not necessary to submit an application for every term you wish to register.

2. **A current, official high school transcript.** A transcript will be required at the end of the tenth and eleventh grades. Official high school transcript can be sent electronically to the Registrar's office, mailed to Wharton County Junior College, 911 Boling Highway-Wharton, TX 77488, or hand delivered to any WCJC campus in a sealed envelope from the high school. Opened envelopes or unofficial transcripts will not be accepted.
3. **Official test scores or exemption test scores that meet the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) as required by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board**, exemptions include:
 - A student with an SAT score of at least 1070 and a math score of at least 500 is exempt from the math requirement.
 - A student with an SAT score of at least 1070 and a verbal score of at least 500 is exempt from the reading and writing requirements.
 - A student with an ACT composite score of at least 23 and a math score of at least 19 is exempt from the math requirement.
 - A student with an ACT composite score of at least 23 and an English score of at least 19 is exempt from the reading and writing requirements.
 - A student with a STARR math score of at least 3500 for the Final Level II Score for Algebra II is exempt from the math requirement. *A student with a STARR math score of at least 4000 for the Level 2 Algebra I and a passing grade in Algebra II is exempt from the math requirement for dual credit math courses.*
 - A student with a STARR English/language arts score of at least 1875 for the Final Level II Score for English III is exempt from the reading and writing requirements. *A student with a STARR EOC, Level 2, English II score of at least 4000 is exempt from the reading/writing requirements for dual credit courses.*
 - A student with PSAT combined minimum score of 107 with a minimum of score of 50 on the critical reading and/or mathematics section linked to the subject area the student wishes to enroll.
 - *A student with a PLAN composite score of at least 23 and a math score of at least 19 is exempt from the math requirement or an equivalent score on the ACT-Aspire as determined by ACT*
 - *A student with a PLAN composite score of at least 23 and an English score of at least 19 is exempt from the reading/writing requirement or an equivalent score on the ACT-Aspire as determined by ACT*
 - *A student who demonstrates college readiness by achieving the minimum pass standards on the TSI assessment instrument*

4. **Completed Certificate for Early Admission form**, available online at <http://www.wcjc.edu/Admissions/admissions-and-registration/student-forms.aspx>. This form can also be requested from the high school counselor's office. Signatures from the Student, Parent/Legal Guardian, and Principal are required.

Other information:

Juniors may take more than two dual credit courses (maximum of three courses) under the following conditions:

- Class rank must be in the top 25%;
- Meet all of WCJC admission requirements.

Seniors may take more than two dual credit courses (maximum of four courses) under the following conditions:

- Class rank must be in the top 25% or must have made A's or B's in Junior level dual credit courses;
- Meet all of WCJC admission requirement

Prior to registration, a list of students who are eligible to take three or four courses should be emailed from the high school principal to the WCJC Dual Credit Coordinator, Dr. Wayne Taylor at waynet@wcjc.edu.

ALL ITV (Interactive Television Courses) classes are "pooled" with other high schools and a specific number of seats are allocated to each school. Enrollment in ITV or any dual credit class taught by a WCJC instructor are on a "first come, first serve" basis. Students who register and pay first will be enrolled in the class. When the class reaches its maximum number of students, the class will be closed.

High school students are not allowed to take remedial/developmental courses.

Students must register and pay for classes every semester. Early registration and payment ensures a class seat.

- Early Fall registration begins in early July
- Early Spring registration begins in early November
- Early Summer registration begins in early April
